

Feed Flying Friends



Being kind to nature is just as important as being kind to each other. This is an easy way to spread kindness to our winged friends who help our ecosystem thrive!

First: Identify which birds are native to your location. Do some internet research to determine what foods these birds eat. If you're unsure, contact your local animal center like a zoo or vet.

Second: Based on your research, set time aside in class to construct easy bird feeders. There are lots of recipes and ideas online, such as <https://www.messylittlemonster.com/2022/10/homemade-diy-bird-feeders.html>.

Third: You can either ask students to bring in the materials they will need or you can purchase them yourself. You could apply for a Random Acts grant to offset the cost to make even more feeders.

Fourth: Determine where you are going to put the creations. You could put them around the school if administrators approve, creating a bird garden. Or, you could donate them to the animal center you contacted earlier. Kids could even put them up around their homes.

Fifth: Lots of people put feeders out in the spring, so consider doing yours in the fall or winter if birds stay in your regions during those times to ensure they have a consistent food supply.
